

## **Biographical Note**

Yitzhak Samuel (Ph.D.) is professor emeritus of sociology, at the University of Haifa, Israel. He carries academic degrees in Sociology, Political Science, Management Science, and Social Psychology. His areas of interest include complex organizations, work and occupations, power and influence and applied sociology. Until recently, he served as the Director of a Graduate Program in Applied Organizational Sociology and, later, as the Director of a Graduate Program in Organization Development. In the past, he served as the Chair of the Department of Sociology & Anthropology at the University of Haifa; as well as the President of the Israeli Sociological Society. Currently, he leads the initiation of a new School of Management at the Western Galilee College in Israel. Among his other roles, he is on the Board of the Center for Organization studies & Human Resource Management at the University of Haifa, and the Academic Advisor to the University's Unit of External Studies. For fifteen years he acted as the Scientific Advisor of the Israeli Human Resources Monthly. For a long period Professor Samuel was in charge of Organization Development, Human Resource Development, and Managerial Development in a State-owned high-tech enterprise. In addition, he practiced as a Senior Organizational Consultant to public and private organizations for over thirty years. He published articles in scientific journals, chapters in books, research reports, and professional books. His books include *Organizations: Features, Structures, and Processes*, 1990, 1996 (Hebrew); *The Political Game: Power and Influence in Organizations*, 2002 (Hebrew); *Work and Organizations in Israel* (co-editor, English), 2004; *The Political Agenda of Organizations*, 2005 (English); and *Organizational Pathology: Life and Death of Organizations*, 2010 (English & Hebrew).
